Miyanodai Observatory

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An observation deck with a height of about 5 m is built on a small hill with an altitude of about 65 m, which runs north from Toyotomi Station along Route 40.

It is a place where you can overlook the meadows of Toyotomi and the Sarobetsu Wilderness.

Originally called the Tokumitsu Observatory or Sarobetsu Observatory It was renamed as Miyanodai Observatory when Hitachinoyama Hitoshi Shinnou visited in 1963.

As a monument to the "birthplace of dairy farming," a statue of a cow of a parent and a child is built on the site.
